FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Tena koutou katoa Ellerslie whānau Cohort Entry

The proposed cohort entry consultation has been completed. Thank you to those who engaged in this process. Since early June the school has consulted with:

- Early childhood providers
- School Staff
- Current school community

The majority of all three groups have indicated that they support the adoption of a cohort entry policy from Term 1, 2025. In fact 78.6% of the community who completed the survey indicated they were in favour of cohort entry.

The Board has now approved the adoption of a cohort entry policy which will start at the beginning of Term 1, 2025. This has been endorsed by the Ministry of Education.

The school is required to give the community at least a term's notice before cohort entry begins. As a reminder, cohort entry only applies to new entrant children who have turned 5. From the beginning of 2025 they will start school in cohort groups. There are 8 cohort entry times throughout the year - 4 at the beginning of each term and 4 at the midway point of each term. Cohort entry does not apply to the enrolment of students coming in to Yrs2-8 and any student coming into Year 0-1 who they have already been enrolled in a school. Cohort entry dates are opposite.



Year 6 Camp

The annual Year 6 camp held at Chosen Valley has become a 'must attend' highlight of the school year. This year was no exception. The last 3 days at camp have been amazing. The 100 students, 7 staff and 16 parents enjoyed a fantastic time out at Ararimu. The students completed 10 activities over the 3 days, on top of having a go on the new flying fox and crazy camp waterslide, the nighttime Burma trail and enjoying roasted marshmallows around the campfire. All of these events were run and organised by our amazing staff and parent helpers. Congratulations to all the students on their efforts, encouragement

and for giving everything a go. Once again they were outstanding ambassadors of Ellerslie School. HEAD LICE - OUTWIT THOSE NITS

There has recently been a case of head lice identified within the school and we wanted to make sure you were kept informed. While lice are nothing more than a nuisance, it is important that children are checked on a weekly basis so that any head lice can be dealt with quickly and before they are allowed to spread too far. It is not possible to completely prevent head lice because they're very common and breed prolifically, however we appreciate your support in trying to keep the outbreak to a minimum. As there is evidence of an outbreak we suggest that you:

- **<u>CHECK</u>** your child's head thoroughly.
- **TREAT** if you find evidence of eggs or lice.
- **<u>RE-CHECK</u>** after treatment to ensure it has worked.


MEDICATION AT SCHOOL
