# Welcome to new Staff and Families

We would like to extend a warm welcome to all our new students and families who have joined the school in the last few weeks. The school roll is now currently sitting at just under 800 students. This is around 30 more students than at the same time last year. Out of the 40 students who have recently enrolled, around 22 have started in Year 0 and 18 have started across the

# **Curriculum Overview for Term 3**

On top of 1 hour each a day of Reading, Writing and Mathematics, the school will also engage in a Science focus this term which will cover a number of different concepts across the school. This includes:

Theme: Innovation - Curriculum Main Focus Area: Science, The Physical World

- Rimu Years 0/1: When things get hot or cold they can change / Heating and cooling/ Floating and sinking
- Rata Year 2: Light and sound innovations with light and sound / Magnets/ Push/pull
- Matai Years 3/4: Electricity how it works/ Building circuits / Recording and timing the Olympics accurately
- Pohutukawa Years 5/6: Air resistance-planes and other transport/Water resistance/Friction/Force of gravity/ Electricity
- Kauri Years 7/8:Global innovation/ Renewable resources, Solar, Wind, Hydro, Electric vehicles

# Attendance

The positive news is that compared to Term 2, 2023 we have improved our attendance rates for Term 2, 2024 by 6%. Last term, 70% of Ellerslie students attended school for over 90% of the term. This is a pleasing result however we are still 10% short of

the national target (80%) and 20% off the school target of '90% of students attending school 90% of the time'. If you require support with school attendance please contact our Learning Support Coordinator - Bailey Harrison baileyh@ellerslie.school.nz.

### Thank you - Dance A thon

We would like to extend our huge appreciation to all those who helped raise money for our Dance A thon back in Term 2. We raised just over \$18,000 which is going towards Stage 1 of the new school and community bike track. As a reminder, Stage 1 involves the installation of a 1.8m new concrete pathway which will link up the back gate with the school's main boulevard. The new pathway will run along the Trends building and down past the portacom classrooms. It will be used by both pedestrians and cyclists meaning people do not have to walk across the wet field after rain. We are currently finalising quotes and will hopefully get the job started before October.

### **Learning Discussions**

The Term 3 Learning Discussions are an important date in the school calendar. It is the time when teachers and parents and students (Yr5-8) connect to discuss how learning is progressing at school. These are happening on Wednesday 7th August from 2.00pm onwards. Please note that in Years 5-8 these discussions are known as Three Way Learning Discussions which involve teachers, parents and students. With this in mind students in Years 5-8 must attend these Three Way Learning Discussions. Years 0-4 students are not required to attend the Teacher, Parent learning discussions. ### **Cohort Entry UPDATE**

The consultation around a proposed move to cohort entry continues. As a reminder, cohort entry would mean children, who have turned five and are new to school, would start in cohorts (groups). During the year there will be 2 cohort entry points, per term (8 in total):

- 1 on the first day of each term (4 times a year)
- 1 at a mid-point during a term. (4 times a year)

Cohort entry is becoming very common for a number of schools and has several advantages. For detailed information about cohort entry please click <a href="here">here</a>. If agreed and finalised, the new cohort entry policy would start at the beginning of Term 1, 2025.

### Measles - what you need to know - from the Ministry of Health

Not enough New Zealanders are immunised against measles, which means there is a very high risk of an outbreak.

- The best protection against measles is two doses of the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine free for all young people aged 18 and under in New Zealand and all adults over the age of 18 who are eligible for free New Zealand healthcare.
- The first symptoms of measles are fever, cough, runny nose and sore red eyes, followed by a red or dark pink rash
  typically starting on the face or behind the ears three days after the first symptoms before moving down the body. If
  you observe these symptoms, encourage parents and/or caregivers to contact their healthcare provider or Healthline
  on 0800 611 116 immediately.

### Talking to your Children about School and Learning

Taking the time to listen and discuss how school is going with your child(ren) is really important, but not always easy. While many times it seems that children are not interested in talking about their day, often it is about asking the right questions, at the right time, removing the distractions and activity listening. For adults this also may mean disconnecting from our own 'busyness' and from our own technology. One thing to realise is that children have different ways of listening. They don't need to be looking at you and could even seem distracted but rest assured they are most likely listening and able to respond. Here are some useful questions that might help to get conversation happening:

- 1. Can you tell me about the best part of your day?
- 2. What was the hardest thing you had to do?
- 3. Who did you play with at break times?
- 4. Did anyone do anything funny?
- 5. What did you talk about or learn today?
- 6. What was the most interesting thing your teacher said today?

Asking positive questions is always a more successful way to get children to talk, however, like adults, sometimes children just don't feel like talking at that particular time. It is important to know when to stop asking questions and leave it for another time. Time and place can also be important for children. Some are happy to chat at the dinner table, others find it easier in the car, while out for a walk or just before they go to sleep. Children are also interested to hear what you have been doing so don't be afraid to get them asking you questions. PŌHUTUKAWA (Years 5 and 6)




