As we embark on the last term of 2024, we extend a warm welcome back to all students and staff. Once again this term will be filled with new opportunities, experiences and the chance to build upon the progress and achievement that has already been made throughout the year. There is still time for students to learn, make a difference and finish the year on a successful note. Learning has been in full swing already over the first 2 weeks of the term. We have also managed to fit in 4 school disco sessions, compete in the EPro Challenge and play in the Eastern Zones Year 7 & 8 Volleyball competition.

Pasifika Leaders

Our first assembly for Term 4 saw the very special announcement and presentation of our first ever Pasifika cultural leaders. These awards went to 3 students who continually demonstrate outstanding leadership within the Pasifika group. Congratulations to Binah Punou, Eva Tausilia and Harlow Herrick. To acknowledge their leadership and commitment they were each presented with a special heilala necklace. Thank you to those who organised this special ceremony, especially Miss Fane Walter, leader of the school's Pasifika group.



Attendance Information - PLEASE READ

It is important that the community is aware of how the school's attendance information is

tracking. The school is focusing on getting every student to school, every day. The government has set a target of wanting 80% of students attending school over 90% of the time by 2030. At Ellerslie we believe that at least 90% of students should be regularly attending school.

Student Categories	Students with	Equivalent to:	
Regular attendance	over 90% attendance	missing fewer than 5 days across a term	
Irregular attendance	more than 80% and up to 90% attendance	absent for between 5 and 9 days across a term	
Moderate attendance	more than 70% and up to 80% attendance	absent for between 10 and 14.5 days across a term	
Chronic attendance	70% attendance or less	absent for 15 days or more across a school term	

In Term 3, 2024, the school's regular attendance rate (over 90% attendance) was **63%** compared with **53%** in Term 3, 2023. While this is an improvement of **10%** from last year, we are still **17%** short of the national target. Attending school everyday is essential for learning. It means your child can:

Make progress in Reading, Writing, Mathematics and other skills

- Feel confident at learning
- Make friends and build social skills
- Develop good habits for life

When students are regularly absent from school they miss out on essential learning

<u>*****</u>	1 day absent each fortnight = 4 weeks per year	which is nearly 1.5 years over 13 years of schooling
****	1 day absent each week = 8 weeks per year	which is 2.5 + years over 13 years of schooling
****	2 days absent each week = 16 weeks per year	which is 5 + years over 13 years of schooling

Structured Literacy and Mathematics Professional Development

As a school, we continue to prepare for the implementation of a new English and Mathematics curriculum from the beginning of Term 1, 2025. In regards to the English curriculum, this involves ensuring all teachers in Years 0-4 have completed a number of professional development sessions involving the teaching of Reading using the structured literacy approach by the end of 2024. This fully government funded initiative continues throughout term 4 and involves all the teachers in Matai Team - Year 3&4 who will be out of school for 3 days in Week 4 working with Liz Kane Literacy, our professional development provider. The final version of the new Mathematics curriculum will be available to schools from the end of October. The school will be focusing on this new curriculum during the upcoming staff only day on Friday 8th November. This will provide an opportunity to examine this new document in greater detail and look at the possible resources that may be required. The school has already been part of a series of mathematics professional development throughout 2024 and this will continue throughout next year.

Great Questions to ask your Children

Parents and caregivers often ask about the best way to engage with children at home in regards to finding out more about their learning at school. Here are those helpful questions to get the conversation started.

- 1. Can you tell me about the best part of your day?
- 2. What was the hardest thing you had to do?
- 3. Who did you play with at break times?
- 4. Did anyone do anything funny?
- 5. What did you talk about or learn today?
- 6. What was the most interesting thing your teacher said today?

If your child is away for 5 continuous days or more, please note that you are required to either:


- Before Travel complete an "Application for Student Extended Leave Form" link
