FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Tena koutou katoa Ellerslie whānau

We have almost completed four weeks of Term 1 and much has already been achieved. Well done to all Year 5-8 students who have been engaged in swimming lessons so far this term. These have been successfully led by Helen and the team at the Y Lagoon Pool and Leisure Centre in Panmure. Thank you to all the parents and caregivers who attended the Meet the Teacher evening. These sessions provided a great deal of information for parents and caregivers. Please contact your child's guardian teacher if you have any further questions.

Attendance

One of the things we are continuing to focus on in 2025 is **student attendance.** Throughout the year you will hear us talking about this with



you, with our students and it remains a strong subject of conversation in the staffroom and across the country. <u>If a student misses one day of school every two weeks, they miss more than a whole year of school by 16 years of age</u>. As a parent or caregiver, you, alongside our school, play a key role in building strong habits of regular school attendance. All students are legally required to attend school every day and it is a shared responsibility to make sure students attend and engage in learning from when they first start school. <u>Students are also required to be on time to school.</u>

You must let the school know if your child is going to be absent or intends to be absent for a portion of the school term for whatever reason, like a tangi or for medical reasons. Family holidays or taking time off for extracurricular activities (not organised by school) are not acceptable reasons for being absent.

Knowing if your child is well enough to go to school can be tricky. Health guidance to support you to decide is available here. If you are still unsure, get in touch with us and let's work together to support your learner. If you are finding it hard to get your child to school, please talk with us so we can work together. Our school is committed to supporting your child to attend school.

Our school continues to build a culture that fosters attendance every day by having:

- · School staff who have strong relationships with students and family.
- · A school culture that recognises your child and your family for who you are, where you come from
- · A school whānau that takes all practical steps to make sure your child is at school and progressing in their learning.
- · A school that is safe and welcoming for everyone in our school community.

If you have any attendance queries and issues, please contact us so we can work together.

OUR TARGET - 80% of students need to attend school 90% of the time through the year.

TUMMY BUGS

We have had a large number of children unwell over the last couple of weeks with tummy bugs - vomiting. This seems to be being passed on from child to child. We ask that children who are unwell are kept at home - please consider other children and staff. These 'bugs' are very contagious based on the high number of children we are seeing. Children should stay home for 24-48 hours after their last episode of vomiting and/or diarrhoea. Please see a medical professional if you are concerned about your child's health.

CHICKEN POX

It appears that we have a family who has been affected by chicken pox. Information from the Ministry of Health website is as follows:

"Chickenpox starts with a fever and/or general unwellness for a day or two followed by a rash. The rash starts out as small spots before changing to blisters with a red base. The rash usually starts on the head and face before spreading to the trunk and then the limbs. Chickenpox is spread by coughing and sneezing and also by direct contact with weeping blisters. It is highly infectious, from up to 2 days before the appearance of the rash until blisters have crusted (usually about 5-7 days)."

We therefore recommend that if you suspect your child has chicken pox, that they be kept home from school until they are no longer infectious. If you think your child has chicken pox or are in any way concerned, please see your family doctor.














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
