FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Another 2 weeks of Term 4 have raced by. This week I have had the pleasure of teaching for 3 days in Matai Team - Years 3/4, while teachers have been on professional development. I have been incredibly impressed at the level of effort the students have put into their learning, their collaboration, thinking skills and ability to get on with the task in hand. I have enjoyed the enthusiasm they display towards their learning and interest they have in the world around them. Well done also to the Year 7/8 students who have participated in the Eastern Zones Volleyball and Touch Rugby tournaments in the last 2 weeks. I can assure the community that while our senior school is small compared to others we compete fiercely at every event we attend. Thank you to those students who attend the annual discos, always a successful outing held in our local community.



Professional Development in Full Swing

The new and final versions of Mathematics and English curricula have been finalised and published - ready for implementation from the beginning of 2025. As a school, our preparations are in full swing. This week, 10 teachers have been participating in 3 full days of learning how to implement the structured literacy approach to the teaching of Reading. This intense, ministry funded professional development has provided a fantastic opportunity for our teachers to be learning together while fine tuning already existing skills and learning new ones. Much of the focus has been on the importance of explicit and target teaching. Early in Term 1, 2025 another 15 teachers from the Year 5-6 area of the school will go through a similar experience to ensure all teachers from Years 0-6 will have the understanding, skills and knowledge to use the structured literacy approach when required.

Our professional development journey continues this Friday, during our Staff Only Day where we will turn our focus at examining and unpacking the Mathematics curriculum. This will involve looking closely at each of the new learning areas as well as discuss what effective teaching of mathematics involves.

RIMU
(Years 0 and 1)

Kia ora Rimu whanau. Welcome to all our new families. We look forward to being a part of your child's Ellerslie School journey. We have had a busy few weeks with our focus on animals and their habitats. We had the Old Macdonald's mobile farm visit us which was very exciting. Some of us had never seen these animals up close, let alone touched them so some very excited children.







We are busy practising our Athletic skills in our PE sessions, preparing for our Athletics Day later on in the term. We had a lot of fun celebrating Diwali with our children and creating some beautiful pieces of Art. A reminder that all children must have their named hats at school to play during morning tea and lunch.



RATA (Year 2) Kia ora Rata whanau

Rata has been learning about food chains this week! We have discovered how these can be varied as they depend on the environment. The children were surprised to find out that plants make their own

food. This learning leads nicely into our upcoming trip to the Botanical Gardens in the coming weeks! As part of our focus on living things, we also investigated what an exoskeleton and an endoskeleton is. Here we are creating our own endoskeleton of a dog using pipe cleaners and looking closely at the shape of a dog. Have a look at how accurate we were!!











MATAĪ (Years 3 and 4) What an interesting and exciting week Matai students and teachers have had! Matai teachers became students earlier this week as we engaged in 3 days of Structured Literacy Workshops where we were supported to build on our Structured Literacy approach including the teaching of phonemic awareness, reading, spelling, handwriting, fluency and vocabulary as well as using assessment tools to track our tamariki's progress. It was great learning and practise for us all and we can't wait to implement some new strategies in our pods.

While we were out, Matai students were left in the capable hands of our relievers, including some of our Senior Leaders Mrs Bilsborough and Mr Butler. The tamariki learnt about the evolution of toilets, the tooth brush, cars and many more interesting topics, they practised relays and used clues to solve some mathematical mystery problems. We all heard how much fun and learning was had in the pods. A friendly reminder the school colour run is happening next week on Friday 15 November, we look forward to seeing those who can make it.


















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
