The 2024 Budget - What it means for Education

The annual budget dominated the media last week with the coalition Government announcing a boost in education spending by \$2.93 billion over the next four years to improve student outcomes. Some of the key figures of additional funding that may benefit the school include:

- \$1.48 billion for education property
- \$199 million over four years including a 3 percent increase for Schools Equity and Isolation Index based components and a 2.5 percent increase for the remaining components of school operating grants
- \$163 million over four years to support Digital Services in schools, including cyber security and equipment replacement
- \$67 million over four years for the implementation of structured literacy in all state primary schools
- \$53 million over four years for teacher supply, retention, and attraction initiatives
- \$45 million over four years in funding for schools to support the rapid increase of ESOL students (English for Speakers of Other Languages)
- \$15 million over four years to increase funding for the School High Health Needs Fund

It is pleasing to see the continued funding of structured literacy initiatives. The school has already accessed some of this funding which is going towards upskilling the staff. While we are hoping the extra investment in school property will help to secure the construction of our new classroom building and future hall, we know this will be consumed quickly across the country as there are several building projects which are currently on hold. I can reassure the community, that the school will

continue to work constructively with the Ministry of Education to ensure our projects remain front and centre so we can get vital infrastructure planned and completed.

Volunteer Hub Staff Morning Tea

Enormous thanks to the large number of parents and caregivers who provided delicious plates of food for the staff morning tea last Thursday. This has become an Ellerslie tradition which is greatly appreciated by all the staff. We understand that preparing this food takes time out of managing busy lives so again many thanks!

Matai Team Movie Night

The second ever Matai Movie Night was held at the end of Week 4. Once again there was a large turnout of Year 3 and 4 students who spent the evening together in Rimu 1 in a variety of evening wear enjoying the movie, Leo. Thank you to Sarah Nuttall and our admin team for organising the event once again and our volunteer helpers for their support on the night. This event provided another opportunity for students and whanau to connect outside school hours.

AQUABOTS COMPETITION 2024

Mr Mac has selected two teams of four Year 5, 6 students to participate in the 2024 Aquabots Competition. What is NZ Aquabots you ask? (Don't panic Mr Mac is here to tell you)

NZ Aquabots is the first underwater robotics programme for school-aged children in New Zealand. In this innovative program, children form teams of four and build an underwater Remotely Operated Vehicle then compete in NZ-themed challenges. Students learn engineering, problem-solving, teamwork, scientific communication and technical applications. Building an aquabot teaches basic skills in design and encourages students to explore naval architecture and marine/ocean engineering principles. It also teaches science, electrical concepts, tool safety and technical procedures. Each year the programme is changed to reflect what is happening in Aotearoa and/or the world. This is the first year that Ellerslie School has taken part, we are very excited to give this the best effort that we can. More updates to follow soon.
