#### **Cohort Entry Announcement - PLEASE READ**

At the May board meeting, the Ellerslie School Board agreed to consult the community on the proposed adoption of a Cohort Entry Policy at Ellerslie School. Cohort entry would mean children, who have turned five and are new to school, would start in cohorts (groups). During the year there will be 2 cohort entry points, per term (8 in total):

- 1 on the first day of each term (4 times a year)
- 1 at a mid-point during a term. (4 times a year)

Cohort entry is becoming very common for a number of schools and has several advantages. For detailed information about cohort entry please click <u>here</u>. If agreed and finalised, the new cohort entry policy would start at the beginning of Term 1, 2025.

#### **Timelines**

- Terms 2 and 3: Consultation period with staff, parents of current and prospective parents, early learning services to consider whether new the policy is generally acceptable.
- Term 3, Week 8: announce the outcome of consultation and release draft new policy
- Term 4, Week 1: Finalise changes if accepted
- 2025, Term 1, Week 1: Adopt new cohort entry policy if accepted

#### **MID YEAR LEARNING SUMMARIES**

On Monday 1 July (Week 10) your child's Mid Year Learning Summary will be available through our online parent portal, from 3.30pm. This summary of your child's progress and achievement over the last two terms has been collated by the guardian teacher with the support and collaboration of other teachers in the pod. This mid year learning summary will include:

- Reading / Writing / Mathematics curriculum progress graphs, indicating what curriculum level and sublevel your child is currently working within.
- A general comment from the Guardian Teacher
- Current and next learning steps in Reading / Writing / Mathematics
- A 5Cs Language of Learning rubric based on Terms 1 and 2
- Effort grades in Reading / Writing / Mathematics

Information within the summary should not be a surprise to parents and caregivers as we have a 'no surprises policy' at Ellerslie. It's really important that parents and caregivers share the information in the summary with their child(ren) and discuss the successes and growth areas. This provides the opportunity for children to identify what they are doing well and what areas they might need to improve in as they head into the second part of the year.

#### **CELEBRATION of LEARNING - The ARTS - TERM 2**

Please join us on Thursday 27 June from 1:40pm - 2:45pm to help celebrate all the amazing learning that has been going on this term. Parents / caregivers and whānau are invited into the learning environments to look at all the inquiry their child(ren) have been doing around Celebrating the Arts. This is a great opportunity to engage with your child(ren) and ask questions about what they have been learning.

- When using the drop-off/pick-up zone outside the school, please note that this is a 2 minute area, and passengers should alight safely on the passenger's side of your vehicle.




#### **MEDICATION AT SCHOOL**
